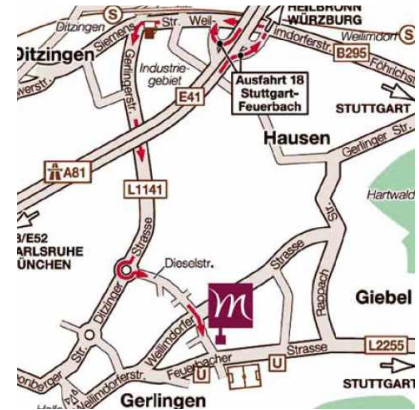

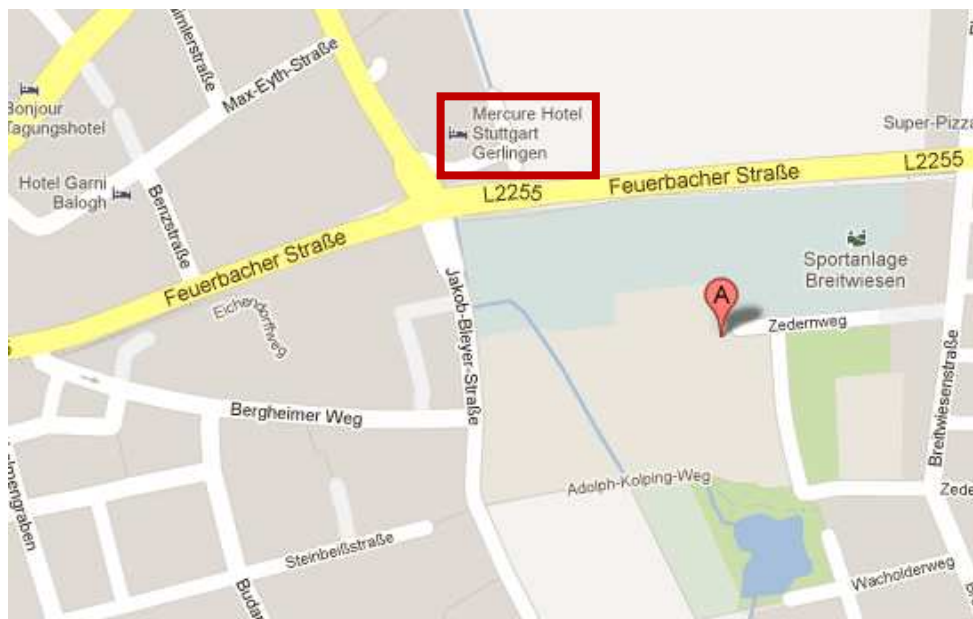

**Information about the Solitude Palace:**

The Rococo Castle Solitude, which cannot hide its relationship with Sanssouci in Potsdam, was built in the years 1764 to 1775 by the building masters Friedrich Weyhing, Philippe de la Guèpière and Reinhold Ferdinand Heinrich Fischer.

The castle itself served for the purpose of representation, for the accommodation of living, social, dining and servants' rooms, on its back side a series of so-called cavalier's buildings were constructed. The facility is connected with the residence castle in Ludwigsburg through a twelve kilometer long, straight street, the course of which can easily be recognized. The High Carls School, a favorite project of Carl Eugen, began its work at Solitude. Schiller's father, the Capitain Johann Kaspar Schiller, was "intendant" at Solitude in those years.

From 1972 to 1983, the castle was completely renovated. Today it is the home of the Academy Castle Solitude, founded in 1990, a Swabian "Villa Massimo" for art scholarship holders from around the world who have been given living, working and exhibition space in the cavalier's buildings.

Information about The Television Tower  
The world's very first television tower is to be found in Stuttgart and has a height of 217 m.

After a construction period lasting 20 months, the Stuttgart Television Tower was inaugurated on 5th February 1956.

Originally the Süddeutscher Rundfunk (South German Broadcasting Company) had intended to install its antennas on top of a 200-metre-high, guyed iron lattice mast. However, Professor Fritz Leonhardt, the famous Stuttgart bridge builder and structural engineer, proposed a concrete tower instead. His concept was not only an innovation from the construction point of view, but also because of the plan to use it for tourism and catering purposes. Thus an aesthetic tower came into being which incorporated an almost circular cylindrical pod with an observation deck, restaurant and transmitter technology. The costs of construction, 4.2 million marks, were recouped within the space of five years from the takings in admission charges.

Today the Television Tower is one of Stuttgart's best-known landmarks. No other view in Stuttgart can compare with its impressive panoramas over the city, the vineyards of the Neckar Valley and the Swabian countryside as far as the Alb, the Black Forest and the Odenwald.

Take a journey through 125 years of fascinating automotive history – and on into the future.

Transporting you to a height of 34 metres, the museum lift will take you on a journey back in time – to the year 1886. For this is where the legend begins, with the pioneering invention of Gottlieb Daimler and Carl Benz – the automobile.

Two interlinked museum tours guide the visitor through the spectacular architecture of the building and the eventful history of the Mercedes-Benz brand – combining the key moments in contemporary world history with super sports cars, Silver Arrows and Gullwings. The two tours lead to the same end point: the innovations of the present.

Over an area covering 16,500 square metres on nine levels, the exhibition presents 160 vehicles and over 1,500 exhibits, divided into Legend rooms and Collection rooms. The Legend rooms document the history of the Mercedes-Benz brand and are subdivided into themes and epochs. The Collection rooms offer a thematic presentation of the wealth and diversity of vehicles made by the brand.

The city centre the **Königstrasse** (4)

Over a kilometer in length – is a busy shopping boulevard with specialist shops, department stores, international chains, cafés, restaurants and relaxation areas. Europe's longest shopping thoroughfares; it begins opposite the main railway station and runs right through the heart of the city. It's amazing, you also pass by the "New Castle".

Built in 1746, the kings of Wuerttemberg resided in the New Castle until the middle of the past century. Today the New Castle is the home of the ministries of the Baden-Wuerttemberg state government and representation rooms.
